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Glossary of P-Gaelic and Q-Gaelic Words

<i>Braighe</i>	The upper part (of places).
<i>Ceilidh</i>	Evening of dance, music, song and storytelling.
<i>Cunamara</i>	Hound of the sea
<i>Curragh</i>	Small traditional Irish boat.
<i>Feis</i>	Literally translated as feast or banquet but commonly understood as celebration.
<i>Hiraeth</i>	Longing or nostalgia, and being indivisible from the land (Welsh).
<i>Ionndrain</i>	A sense of loss/longing which comes from the removal from ancestral land (Irish).
<i>Steidh</i>	Theme
